The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) sets the requirements for what grades are routinely screened for vision and hearing.

Children to have vision screenings

- Preschool children attending a school-based program shall be screened each year he/she is enrolled in preschool.
- School-aged children must be screened in grades: Kindergarten, first, third, fifth, seventh, ninth and eleventh.
- In addition, the following school children should be screened annually or upon occurrence:
- Children new to the school with no previously documented vision screening.
- Children referred by a teacher or other school personnel.
- Children absent during the previous vision screening.
- • Children whose parent/guardian request a vision screening.

Children to have hearing screenings

- Preschool children attending a school-based program shall be screened each year he/she is enrolled in preschool.
- School-aged children shall be screened at six grade levels: kindergarten, first, third, fifth, ninth and eleventh.
- In addition, the following school children shall be screened annually or upon occurrence:
- Students new to a school (and not tested within the past 12 months).
- Students referred by a teacher or other school personnel.
- Students who were referred within the past year with no documented follow-up, regardless of grade.
- Students absent during the previous hearing screening.
- Students at risk for noise exposure (e.g., band, vocational education, industrial education, automotive mechanics).
- Students who request a hearing screening.
- Students whose parent/caregiver request a hearing screening.
